Therefore, the club's roles and responsibilities are set out below:

Policy aims

- To promote a safe and positive environment for all young and at risk persons to attend any TWMC events.
- To provide all the necessary information for all event staff and volunteers to meet the clubs safeguarding responsibilities as set out by the government guidance and legislation.
- To be able to demonstrate the club's commitment to keep all young and at risk persons safe at any club run event.

There are many types of abuse / harassment, and it is important that all attendees at any event are aware they have a duty to ensure the type of abuse that could cause a concern as listed but not wholly defined:

- Bullying
- Cyber abuse
- Peer on peer abuse
- Racial abuse
- Physical abuse
- Emotional abuse
- Neglect

Issues can occur at any level of motorsport, and it is important to obtain the correct information for all parties.
